

Voting by corporate bodies

A corporate body which owns or occupies land in a municipal area is entitled to nominate one person to vote on its behalf at an election in that municipal area.

A corporate body may nominate only one person to vote on its behalf at an election in a municipal area regardless of whether it owns or occupies land in several locations in that municipal area.

Nominations to vote must be done by completing this approved form, signed by the nominated person, and lodged with the general manager. The general manager may reject the nomination if:

- » satisfied that the corporate body is not the owner or occupier of land, or
- » satisfied that the nominated person:
 - » is not over the age of 18, or
 - » is serving a term of imprisonment, or
 - » is subject to an initial order or a continuing care order under the *Mental Health Act 1996* or an order under the *Guardianship and Administration Act 1995*.

A nomination has effect until a fresh corporate nomination is made, or it appears to the general manager that:

- » there has been a change in the ownership or occupation of the land in respect of which the entitlement to vote arises, or
- » the nominated person is no longer entitled to be nominated, or
- » the nomination has been revoked.

Maximum number of votes?

An elector, in an election in respect of one municipal area, has no more than 2 votes, of which -

- » only one vote is in his or her own right, and
- » only one vote is on behalf of a corporate body.

What happens when this enrolment form is lodged?

If the nomination is accepted by the general manager, the name of the nominated person will be placed on the electoral roll for the relevant municipal area, along with the address of the land for which the corporate body is claiming the enrolment. The nominated person will be sent a postal vote for each election for that municipal area.

Will all information on this form appear on the public version of the general manager's roll? What happens when I send in my enrolment form?

Electoral rolls are made available for public inspection and may be provided to:

- » the Tasmanian Electoral Commission and contractors for the purpose of conducting council elections, and
- » candidates in accordance with the *Local Government Act 1993*.

Only the name of the nominated person and the address within the municipal area linked to the corporation will appear on the inspected version of the general manager's roll.
